Dear Parent/Carer

Welcome to the Weavers Academy community. With the allocations arriving this week, we wanted to communicate with you as quickly as possible to reassure you that we are already giving the transition arrangements our fullest attention. We are always determined to ensure the transition from Year 6 to Year 7 will be a positive experience and will fully address all academic learning and personal development.

It is an exciting time for all students moving up to secondary school and everyone at Weavers Academy will be working hard to ensure that the experience is rewarding for all involved.

I would like to welcome your child to the Academy and explain specific aspects of the secondary transfer process which I believe that you will find helpful.

An important figure throughout the process will be our Transition Lead, Mr Mawby, who leads and co-ordinates the transition process.

Mr Mawby and key Year 7 pastoral team members led by Miss Goddard will be making as much contact as possible with students through a variety of means. Visits will take place in person to students in their primary schools throughout May and June. This will give us an opportunity to meet the students and provide them with a glimpse into what life is like at Weavers Academy. We also look forward to talking to their Year 6 teachers so that we can gather as much information as possible which we will use to inform the way that we organise teaching, learning and pastoral care.

All students will participate in induction days when they will visit the school. These visits are scheduled to take place on Monday 1 and Tuesday 2 July. Times and specific day/days your child will need to attend will be confirmed at a later date. These days are Wellingborough-wide induction days where all Year 6 students will visit their new schools.

The induction days will be based around team-building activities and taster lessons. This will give them a chance to meet their form tutor, to get to know others in their form and to enjoy many tours of the school. They will meet many members of staff throughout the induction days undertaking a variety of lessons to ensure they have a chance to see what daily life will be like in Year 7.

The other key date is when parents will have the opportunity to visit Weavers Academy to meet staff in June/July, the dates for this will be confirmed to you in the coming months. This will be your chance to meet form tutors and other key staff. More information will go out regarding this event nearer the time.





Arbor – Our Academy communication and database system

You will receive a separate email from our database system Arbor. You will need to create your account to activate all the information gathering process. The creation of the account needs to be done in a specific way to ensure the account can be activated.

These are the specific details of the logging in process:

- When parents log on to Arbor for the first time it must be through Google
 Chrome (no other browser) on a mobile, tablet, desktop or laptop. It is advised
 that you do not use a mobile for this initial setup, as the connection to Arbor is
 more effective through tablet desktop or laptop. The app <u>cannot</u> be used until
 you have first logged in through Chrome.
- You cannot set up your password through the app, as the links in the reset
 password emails only work with a browser. You can reset your password using
 a computer or using a mobile browser on your phone or tablet.
- Once your password has been set up, you can log into the Parent Portal by going to login.arbor.sc and inputting your email address and password. If you have a child at more than one Arbor school, you will be asked to select the appropriate school. Enter your password, then click Log in.
- Students must also first log in using Google Chrome on a mobile, tablet, desktop or laptop to https://weaversacademy.uk.arbor.sc/
- Students cannot use the app- it is only for parental accounts.

We would be grateful if you would complete all the information forms on Arbor as soon as possible after the link goes live. Further exemplification of GDPR Compliant Privacy Notices on the use of data can be found on the Weavers' website.

I would like to take this opportunity to emphasise just how important these medical and personal information forms are. We are required to have 2 contacts in the emergency contact information section in case the first one is not reachable. Please ensure there are 2. If your child should be taken ill or is injured whilst at school, it is vital that we are able to contact a parent/carer during the working day. If this is not possible, then the name of a relative, friend or neighbour who could take responsibility for your child is required. If we do not receive this information by 20 June 2024, we reserve the right to withdraw your child's place for the transition days.

Email addresses are now essential as a means of communicating with parents, so please ensure a valid email address is supplied. We send letters, reports, newsletters, and all other communications via email.

The personal details form asks you to indicate who has parental responsibility for your child as defined by the "Children Act" (1989). This status is quite separate from issues of residency.

Uniform

Please see the Academy website for the uniform order form and our Uniform Policy. Order forms should be completed by the end of May to enable the uniform to be delivered in time for the school year, also taking into account items needing to be returned and/or swapped size.
